



Florida Water's Marion County System Sold

DULUTH, Minn.--ALLETE, Inc. (NYSE: ALE) announced today that its subsidiary, Florida Water Services Corporation, has closed on a sale, by condemnation, of its water and wastewater system serving Marion County, Florida. The system has been sold to Marion County for approximately \$22 million.

Florida Water Services, the largest investor-owned utility system in Florida, has been in the process of selling its assets as part of an ALLETE strategic initiative to exit its water businesses. Presently, approximately 85% of Florida Water assets have been sold or are under contract to be sold for \$417 million, which represents an after-tax gain to Florida Water, net of all selling and transaction costs, of about \$75 million. To date, the expected net cash proceeds after transaction costs, retirement of Florida Water debt, and payment of income taxes are approximately \$210 million. Net proceeds from the sale will be used to retire debt at ALLETE.

Florida Water Services continues to seek buyers for its remaining systems.

ALLETE's holdings include ADESA, the second largest wholesale vehicle auction network in North America; AFC, the leading provider of independent auto dealer financing; Minnesota Power, a low-cost electric utility that serves some of the largest industrial customers in the United States; and significant real estate holdings in Florida.
